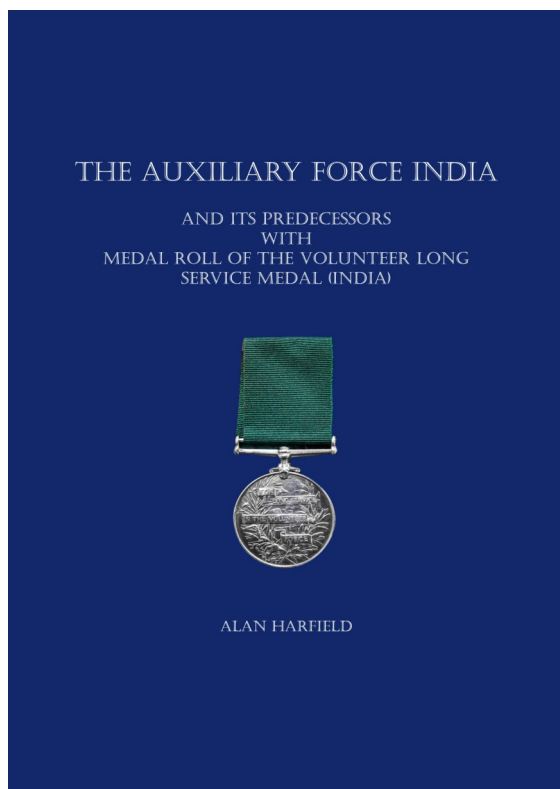


THE AUXILIARY FORCE INDIA and its predecessors With Medal Roll of the Volunteer Long Service Medal (India)

Volunteer units – consisting, like the Rifle Volunteers in Great Britain, and their successors, of part-time volunteers that could be 'called-out' to aid the Civil Power during times of domestic unrest – were formed in hundreds of towns and cities throughout British India. This book provides details of them all.

Following this essential background there are histories of every volunteer unit, including Light Horse and Mounted Rifles, Artillery, Engineers, Signallers and infantry, Railway Corps and various miscellaneous units.

These records provide a chronicle of the fortunes of the volunteer movement in India, its organisation, armament, uniforms, training activities and occasional employment in aid of the civil power.
