

Bendall & Harner were wounded and all four received the Conspicuous Gallantry Medal. Furthermore, all four were evidently present at the memorial unveiling as this work is signed by all of them: Cleaver & Bendall on the title page & Harner & Roxburgh alongside their portraits within. The tp is additionally signed by Col. G. Stinglhamber DSO (a key figure in the establishment of the Zeebrugge Musuem & a frequent commentator on the events of 1918), & a crew member of HMS Iris II (LS C.J. Bush DSM) & one of HMS Vindictive. Photographs include the crew of C3, the remains of the sub. showing at low tide, the break in the mole & other interesting pictures.
